Dear Parents/Carers,

We've had a really successful term in school, and I just wanted to write to update you about a few important things.

Attendance and Punctuality

Most children arrive at school 'On Time, at Quarter-to-Nine', but we have seen an increase in pupils arriving late in the morning. We have a short drop-off time, 08:45 - 08:50, to ensure that children don't miss any of their learning. Last year, we had a lot of children missing more than five minutes of their learning daily, and this added up to over sixteen hours of learning time across the year. It was an awful lot of learning to miss, and we have turned this around so we now have hardly any children missing their learning. I know you'll agree that this change is the right thing for our children.

I know many of you will have noticed how hard we are working to improve attendance; this is because attendance is very, very important. We are also working hard to ensure that the curriculum and teaching really helps children to catch-up, by recapping missed learning and moving children on quickly; this means that missed learning has much more impact on children.

We hope you will join us in trying our very best to achieve our 96% Attendance target

Christmas Events in School

One of the things that makes us most proud of our school is our multicultural ethos; we have more than thirty languages spoken across the Academy, and we have families from across the UK and the world. This gives us an amazing opportunity to learn from and about each other, and this is a big part of our everyday curriculum in school. When it comes to Christmas, we want children to understand where the celebrations come from, why our Christian community celebrates Christmas. We also want everyone to have an opportunity to enjoy some of the magic and mystery of Christmas, such as Christmas Trees, lights and other festivities; so we will be running a series of small events across the coming week

We always work really hard to make sure we're inclusive and sensitive in every activity in school - It's what we do, it's one of the most important ways of us 'Being Co-op'.
